FLAVOR PROFILE

Powerful malt backbone is balanced with aromatic herbal hop character to maximize the earthy sweetness of malt and the tangy herbaceous seasoning of heavy hopping.

HISTORY

English brewers began to see the potential of exporting their beers late in the 18th century. Getting beer to far off markets like India, where thousands of British soldiers and officials lived, in good condition, was a challenge. Brewers in Burton-upon-Trent, decided to increase the hops from around 25 ibu, for the popular "bitter pale ale," to 65 ibu in order to brew a high gravity hoppier beer; both hops and alcohol preserve beer. A dozen local brewers then began producing a beer they called India Pale Ale. People at home and abroad loved the beer, and breweries in Burton became the largest in the world in the 1800s.
